Trail Map

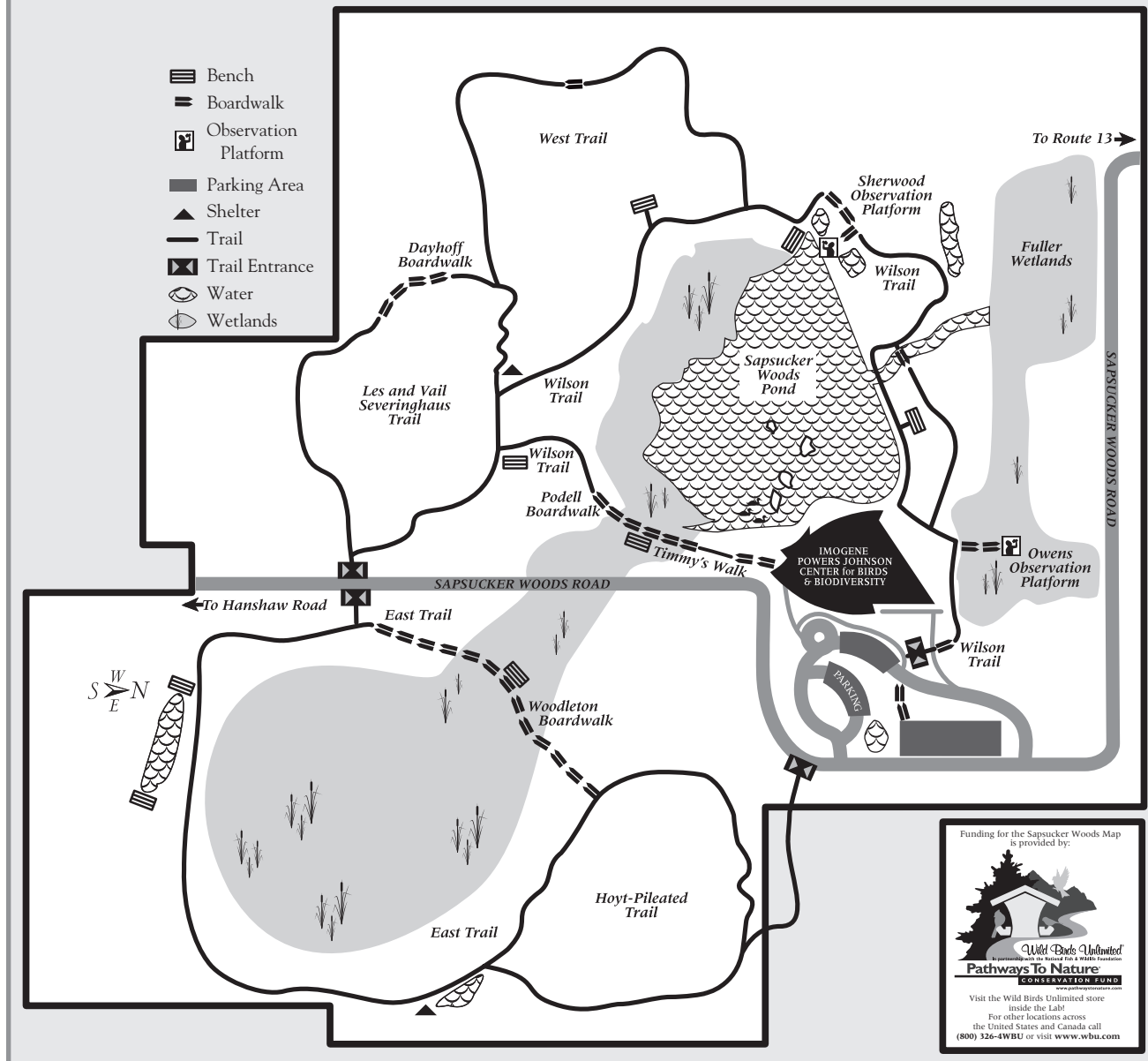
